

However, the service area ZIP Codes are nearly identical to the county boundary, except for 39097 (Louise), which is in neighboring Humphreys County.

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




Yazoo County's unemployment rate is higher than the state and national rate, but is following the same trends as those benchmarks.




Physician supply in the Service Area is determined by the DHHS data and by querying the AMA Directory of Physicians for the county.

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Primary Care Provider Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)









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
AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY¹




ALL CAUSES OF DEATH²






